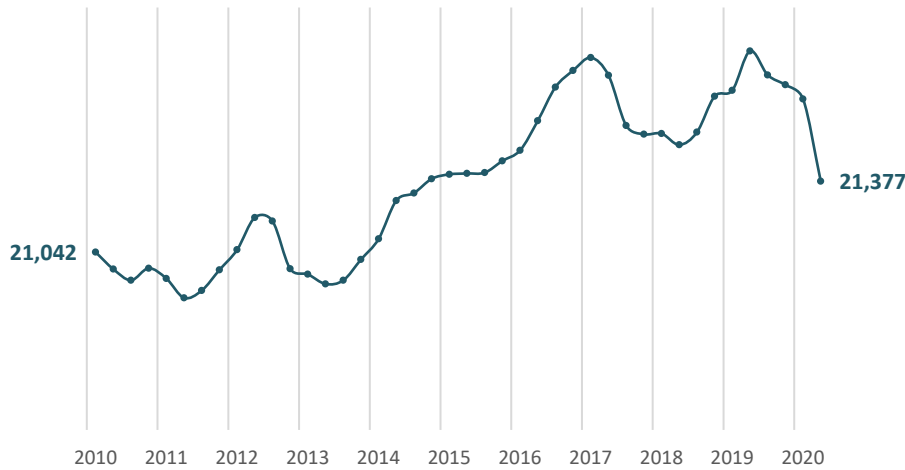

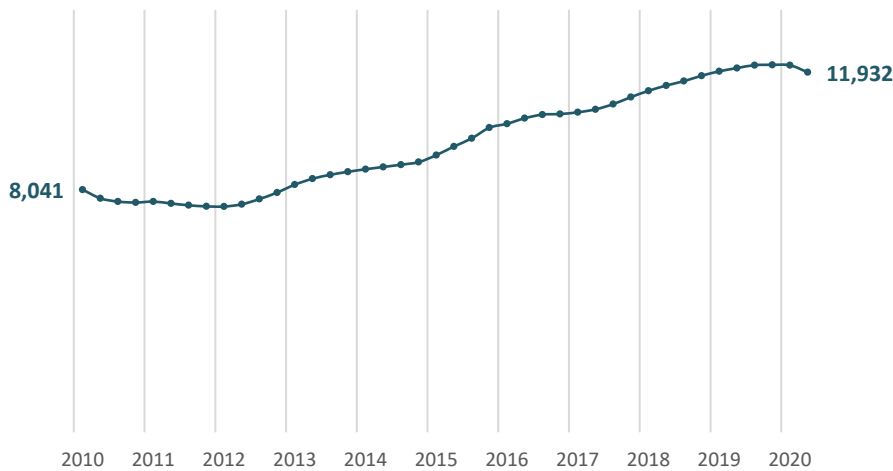

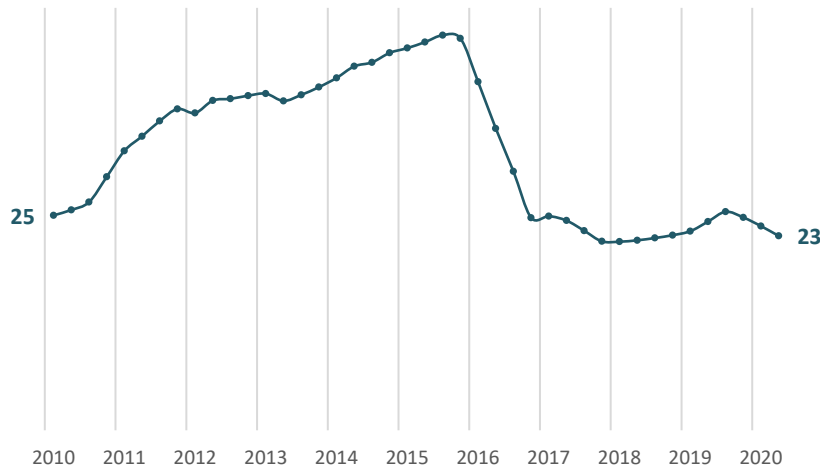

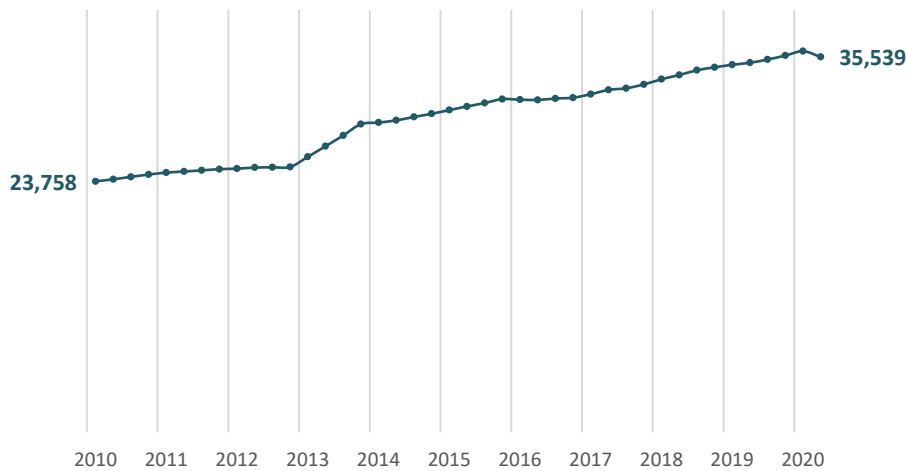

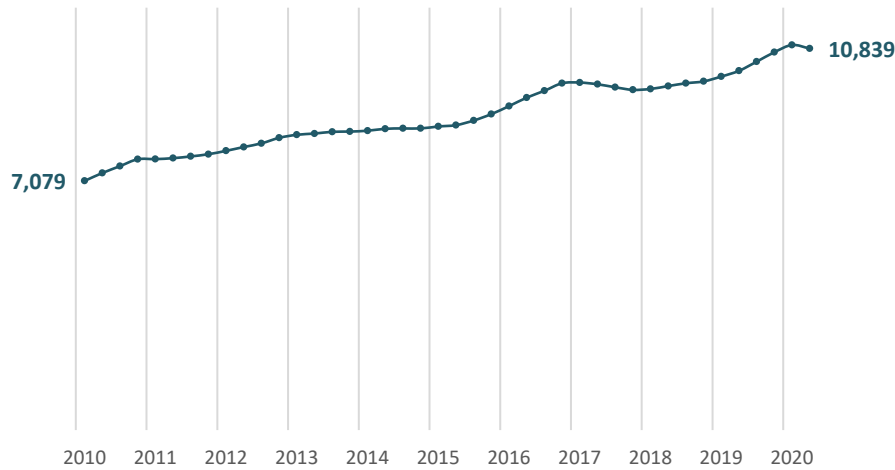

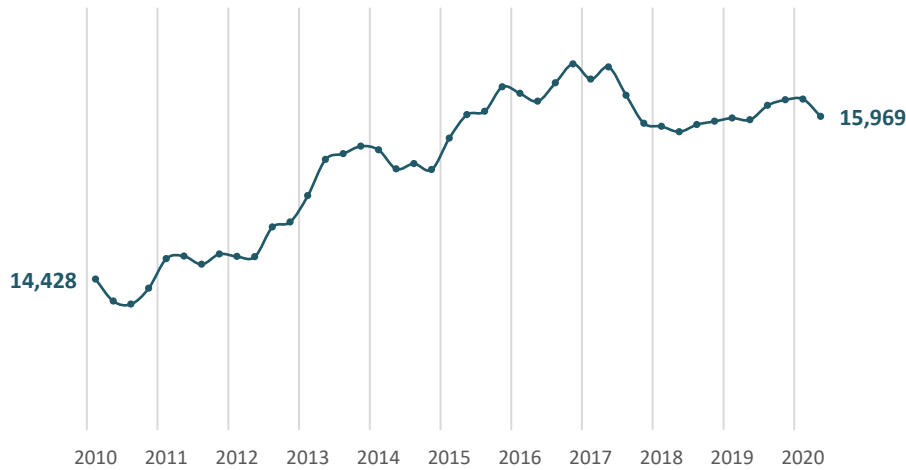

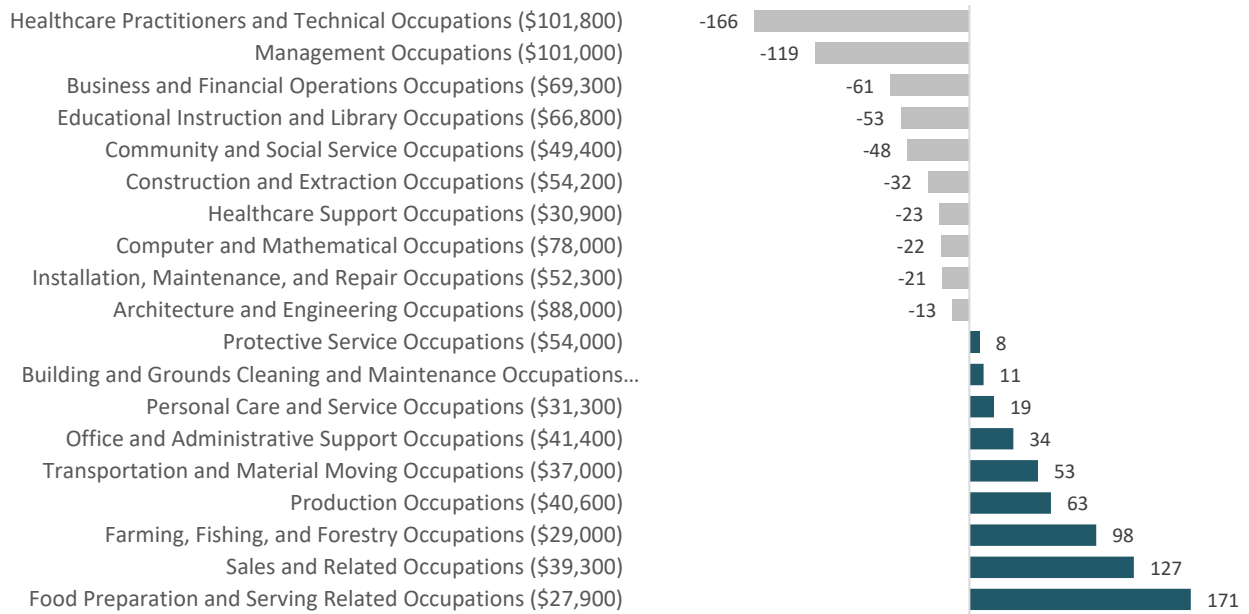

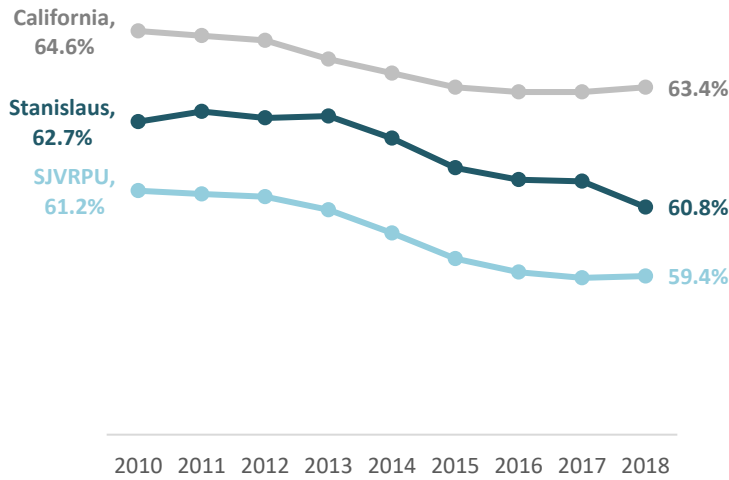

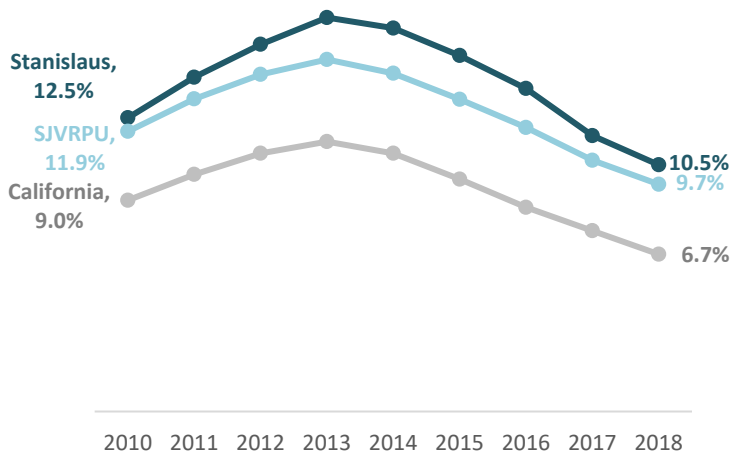

Figure 9. Stanislaus County Unemployment Rate 2010-2018



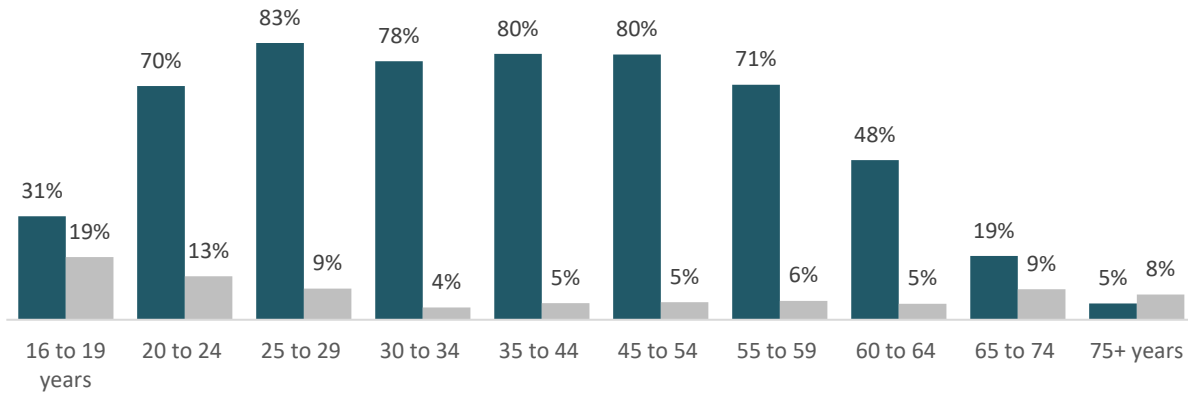

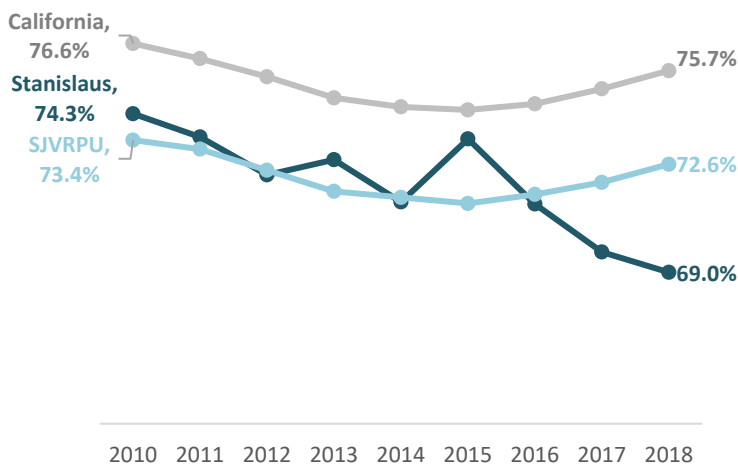

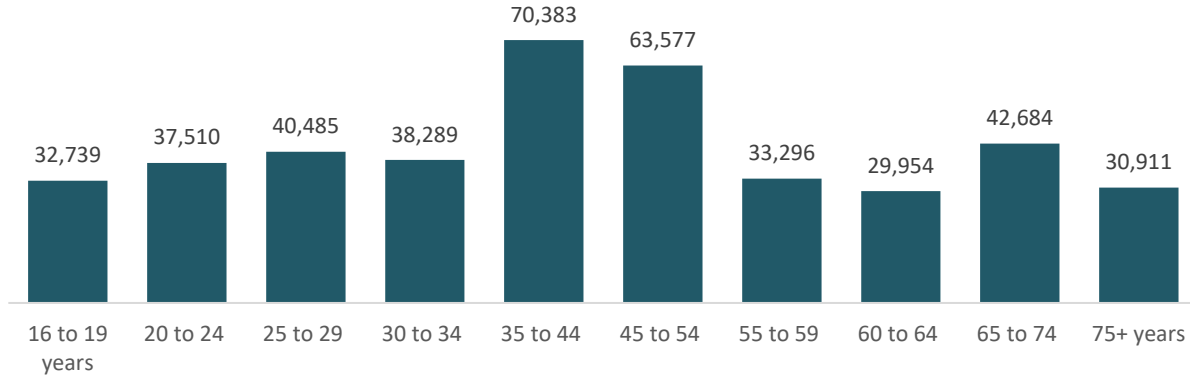
Figure 11. Stanislaus County Veterans Labor Force Participation

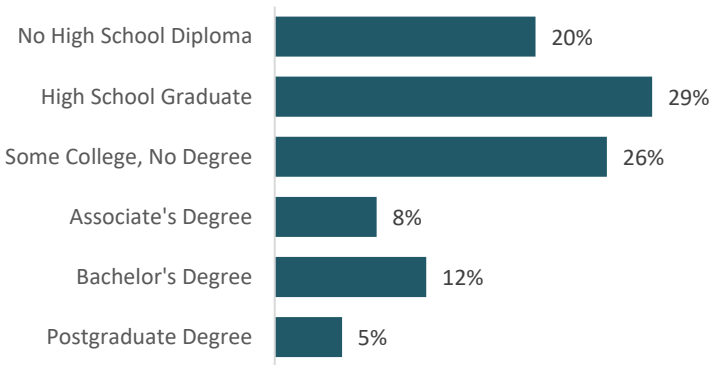

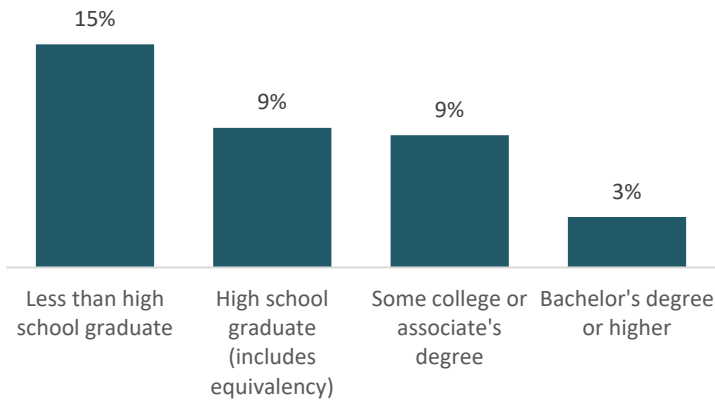

Figure 13. Stanislaus County Educational Attainment, Age 25-64



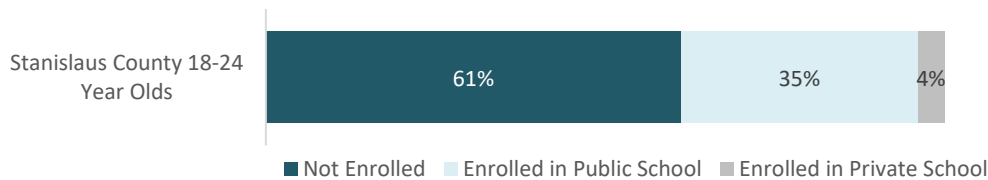
